STUCKNESS - the condition underlying most problems

Not everyone grows up as they get older. The immaturity rampant among adults illustrates this fact. Kids who get stuck are prone to a diverse array of problems and disorders, which in turn, distract us from the root problem. After years of dealing with most every kind of difficulty and disorder, Dr. Neufeld has come to the conclusion that the construct of stuckness holds the most promise for making sense of troubled children as well as for opening doors for change.

Whether the presenting problem is aggression, impulsivity, depression, hyperactivity, bullying, resistance, anxiety, separation problems or chronic misbehaviour - or whether the diagnosis is autism, Aspergers, attentional deficit, fetal alcohol syndrome, attachment disorder, Tourettes, conduct disorder, oppositional defiant disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder - the best bet for understanding the dynamics involved and for effecting lasting change is through the construct of stuckness. Even in cases where the problem cannot be cured, resolving the stuckness can often lift the ceiling on development significantly.

In fact, most adult problems are extensions of this stuckness. Hence, understanding the dynamics of stuckness can greatly enhance one's effectiveness as an adult therapist as well, whether one is working with individuals, couples or families.
